Jerusalem / Palestine.

YMCA East Jerusalem was reporting in late November that it was finding it increasingly difficult to operate with many of it's staff unable to travel in and around the West Bank. Planned 75th Anniversary Celebrations have been postponed. Due to the heavy bombardment, YMCA Gaza could not communicate with the wider YMCA movement The Centre at Beit Sahour was operating reduced hours and services. The Vocational Training Centre in Jericho had temporarily closed to students and shifted to online education and hosted 33 Gazan workers in student dorms facing difficult living conditions

An appeal for US \$ 350,000 has been launched to support their current priorities focussed on the West Bank

- Providing Psychological First Aid kits to counsellors for emergency support, offering urgent medical assistance and support to Gazan workers stranded in the West Bank including Ramallah, Hebron, Bethlehem, tubas, Nablus and Tulkarem .
- Addressing the needs of affected communities in Bethlehem and Hebron by providing food, hygiene, medical supplies, safety kits, and mental health support.
- Providing Post Trauma Support for members beneficiaries and staff, ensuring safety and staff salaries for the next three months

It is with sadness that we record the death of Pip Wilson in September aged 84. Pip was formally the General Secretary of Romford YMCA. Having worked amongst the gangs of East London described in his book 'Gutter Feelings', he was amongst the most inspirational and innovative youth worker and trainer of youth workers in his generation. Famous for his popular Spectacular Stinking Rolling Magazine Show, Pip was a popular and much in demand at Greenbelt. Eurocross and other Christian and arts festivals. His famous 'Blob Tree' exercises devised with lan Long continue to be a well-used resource in youth work and therapy work driven by his belief that everyone is a 'Beautiful Human Person'

Continuing Val Wallis' "skip" through her 50 years plus YMCA Experience shared with us at the Cambridge lunch this year.

My first chairmanship and yes it was chairman in those days, was the Regional Youth forum. There was a Regional Council for the grey suit brigade and a different one for young people. I remember organizing a crazy games competition between local associations.

Perhaps I am one of the few people that have taken part in the 125, 150 and 175 YMCA celebrations but in 1969 I was part of the colour party carrying Regional Flags into St Paul's Cathedral

When thinking about what I was going to include today it was hard to cut it down to size. This one-time quiet shy girl could keep you here hours talking about the YMCA but I did want to include my first experience at a National Young Members Conference at Woodside, Skegness. Not a grey suit in evidence. During the weekend we had an evening of entertainment. I was put on the stage behind screens, seductive music played and items of clothing similar to what I was wearing came over the screens. The screens were removed to show me standing at an ironing board and "dashing away with the smoothing iron" was played. I don't think we would get away with that now.

I was very aware of tokenism in those early days, if you had a young person on a committee in ticked a box if it was female in ticked two. I was asked to sit on a British Conference committee. The YMCA had done a research report and a Conference was to be held to decide the way forward. There was one other young person Chris Maynard from Reigate whom I knew but I was the only female. At the first coffee break Ronnie Howe came up to me and said if you require the toilet, I will have to show you the way. We were in 112 Great Russell Street the YMCAs headquarters and the only female toilet in the building was down in the cleaner's cupboard

Everyone else was Fred John and Harry I was, Miss Pay. It was suggested that night before the conference there would be a dinner Dance, one male asked if they could bring their wives "otherwise Miss Pay was going to be very busy". Miss Pay said "if it was a conference to attract young members was a dinner Dance quite the right scene setter." There was just a reception the night before!



Roy Holgate was to become a huge influence in my life always encouraging me to step out of my comfort zone and not to do an auto reject on opportunities - however scary they may look.


