What will not have escaped many is that Wales is not reflected within our email addresses and therefore '@england.ymca.org.uk' is no longer fit for purpose.

In an effort to be more inclusive what has now changed is that all YMCA England & Wales staff email addresses will now end '@ymca.org.uk'. The changes came into effect from 4pm on Friday 28 July.

The current email domain will remain as an alias address temporarily, so any emails that are sent to this address will still be received by the recipient.
